

# A Message from the President

# My Cup Overflows with Blessings



Life happens...ready or not.

Childhood memories are precious to me. I grew up in a large extended family. We spent many summers together at my grandparents' home in Alabama. I loved those summer days. I can remember waking up to the smells of my grandmother's breakfast cooking...and sitting down around the big oak table with all the aunts and uncles and cousins and...there was always plenty of breakfast to go around...and we were all there together at the same time...and we were all excited in anticipation of the daily events ahead...and we were all chattering and giggling... and then... my grandfather would sit down at the head of the table. Then...we were all still for just one moment...all at the same time. He was the family patriarch...due all respect. We feared him...and we loved him dearly. He was our "Pop." He would say, "Are you ready?" And he would wait until we all bowed our heads and closed our eyes...and then he would say, "Let's be thankful." And one of us, who had been appointed the night before, would ask the blessing, "Lord, make us thankful for all the many blessings we are about to receive in the bounty of Christ. Amen." And then we would go back to what we were doing...and eat until we were filled...and we were blessed.

The rest of the day, we played outside (unless it rained) while the big people tidied the house and made preparations for the evening meal. The girls built tree houses and forts with the boys, or we made tea sets with acorns to use for our dolls when the boys played football or something else rough. Sometimes we played hide and seek for hours on end. The cousin who was "IT" would lean against a tree (home base), cover his/her eyes, and count slowly to a hundred while everyone else ran to hide I had my favorite hiding places. I alternated them to throw "IT" off my trail. I would run quickly to one of them and sit still. "IT" would yell, "Coming! Ready or not!" I would wait until I heard "IT" find someone else.

The person caught would put up a noisy fuss, giving me ample time to slip out of hiding, run to home base and call out. "I'm home!"

Once or twice during the day, my grandmother would bring us a pitcher of lemonade with enough cups to go around. We marked our cups with different colored straws...and Heaven help the one that picked up the wrong cup! At the end of the day, we would chase lightning bugs and listen to crickets' chirp and walk around barefooted on the grass waiting for the moon to rise in the evening sky. I loved that big backyard.

After supper and baths, we were tucked into bed. My mother and aunts never failed to hear our prayers before we all said the Lord's Prayer together and went to sleep on the big screened porch. The nights were cool and quiet and peaceful...and we were loved.

That big backyard was my "happy place", my home base...the place where I learned to be still and know God. My grandmother's table was where I learned that I was blessed... and how to be thankful to God for all His blessings. Home was where I was filled with God's love...and where memories were planted in my heart.

But, ready or not, life happens. Those people, times, and places have moved on...only precious memories remain...those memories that taught me to be still and know God. I think about those times a lot now when I wake up in the morning at Kanuga and smell breakfast cooking...or walk around the lake and trails to find new secret places...or touch base again sitting still on the rocking chair porch, listening to the crickets chirp. I feel at home with God at Kanuga. I am humbled and thankful to share His happy place and sit at His table with His sons and daughters. "My cup overflows with blessings." Life happens at Kanuga. I know that God is there...and that God IS ...there.

# Not an option...

In an article in the Teaching quarterly of the C.S. Lewis Institute, Thomas Tarants,III wrote... When we speak of knowing God, it is important to understand that we are not talking about an abstract or speculative thought concerning God or mystical

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experiences but about coming alive to God through Jesus Christ and surrendering ourselves to Him in grateful love (Romans 12:1). As John says" whoever had the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life (1 John 5:12). Knowing God is not an optional part of the Christian life..it is the Christian life! Our theme for these three years is taken from Psalm 46 and it reads..."Be still and know that I am God. "Here the word -still -comes from a Hebrew word meaning "to let go or release- we need to come to a place where we are willing to submit ourselves to God acknowledging that He is in total control...and this is not easy to do. By nature we want to be in control and letting go and letting God means totally trusting Him.

I remember as a young boy calling my mother and father and hearing no response running into their room and finding each kneeling on their sides of the bed with their outstretched hands clasped as they prayed. I remember retreating and feeling that this was "holy time" for them not to be interrupted. I remember years later Dad had left Cuba and was living in Florida. He had suffered a stroke. Fortunately I was on a trip to the **U.S.A.** and stopped by from the Dominican Republic. Dad was in a hospital bed with the protective rails up..and as I walked in, I found Mom kneeling with her hands outstretched...clasping Dad's hands...praying.

"Be still and know that I am God". I know that they knew God and they surrendered themselves to His will experiencing the fullness of all God wanted for them and wants for us.



# Keynote Speaker !!

The Right Reverend Gregory O. Brewer

**Know That I AM GOD** 

We are excited to Welcome The National Chaplain of our Order as our Keynote speaker at Kanuga this Fall. The Right Reverend Gregory O. Brewer was ordained the fourth bishop of the Diocese of Central Florida on March 24, 2012. In Central Florida, major focuses of his ministry include raising up the next generation of lay and clergy leadership and looking at our community neighborhoods and facing the missionary challenge that is before us. A firm believer in the power of intercessory prayer, Bishop Brewer is honored to be serving as the National Chaplain of The Order of the Daughters of the King ® (DOK) where he hopes to offer spiritual guidance especially as it pertains to the DOK's Rule of Prayer.



**Before** 

being called to Central Florida, Brewer served as rector at Calvary-St. George's Church, a 500-member, multicultural and multiracial parish with landmarked historic buildings in downtown Manhattan. Prior to his move to New York, he was rector of Church of the Good Samaritan, Paoli, Pennsylvania, for 11 years.

Bishop Brewer was assistant professor of pastoral theology at Trinity Episcopal School for Ministry in Ambridge, Pennsylvania, from 1992–1996. For 16 years previously, he had served parishes in the Diocese of Central Florida including The Episcopal Church of the New Covenant, a diocesan church plant. He was ordained a deacon at St. John's Episcopal Church, Lynchburg, Virginia, and ordained a priest at All Saints Episcopal Church, Winter Park, Florida. He has published articles in *The Anglican Digest*, with articles appearing regularly from 1985–2007. Other publications include *Bible Reading Fellowship: Journey Through the Word Series* and *The Coming of the Lord, Second Corinthians*.

Bishop Brewer earned his B.A. from Lynchburg College, Virginia, where he received the Hugh M. Burleigh Award for Outstanding Ministerial Student in 1973. He received his M.Div. from The Virginia Theological Seminary in 1976.

Married for almost forty years, Bishop Brewer and his wife Laura Lee (whom we hope will join him ar Kanuga) actively engage in their hospitality ministry with regular clergy dinners and parish visitations. They are the proud parents of five sons and three granddaughters.

We are excited to hear Bishop Brewer's message for us at Kanuga.
