MESSAGE FROM THE CHAPLAIN



Our theme for the province during this Triennial has taken us deep into an understanding of but a few verses of the 46th Psalm. Verse 11 reads as follows...

Be still then and know that I am God, I will be exalted among the nations: I will be exalted in the earth.

We have been forced in so many ways to be still... My daughters told Debbe and me, that with our underlying medical issues (our systems are compromised), we should hunker down and stay home and entrust them to deliver what groceries we needed. It was after 7 weeks of quarantine that we ventured to a grocery store... masks on and disinfectant wipes as constant companions.

This journey has been difficult, but having this theme before us has helped us to "Re-focus"... to understand these words in a deeper way. The word "still" comes from a Hebrew word meaning to "let go" or release. It can be best understood in that we need to come to a place where we are willing to totally submit ourselves to God... and here is the difficult one... acknowledge that He is in control.

This pandemic has helped enrich Debbe and me in our prayer conversations with God and sharing in Eucharist over our coffee table while streaming the service from Old Saint Andrews Parish Church has fed us in untold ways. The concept of "surrender" and "trust" have been enriched.

As I read the entire Psalm, I was moved by some words that are repeated every 4th verse... making their importance very clear. "The Lord of hosts is with us, the God of Jacob is our refuge." I was reminded of words written by one our own, Susan Keith, in a poem titled "God is with us."

The whole world is fighting a dis-ease Yet I have no doubt that God is with us. How else could all the nations of the world Unite in one accord and in one voice.

God is with us!

People have sickened in all the corners of the earth.
People are dying.
Yet God has provided shelter
Refuge from this illness.

God is our refuge!

We are able to shelter in our homes Yet continue to reach out in love and concern. We are able to get medical care With minimal exposure to other ills.

God is an ever present help!

Be still.
Listen for the voice of God.
Take comfort from God's wisdom.
Learn from God's wisdom.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER – FR. TOM PHILLIPS



Father Tom Phillips is Priest-in-charge of Church of the Incarnation, in Oviedo, Florida. He was ordained to the Priesthood on Palm Sunday 2018, and started at Incarnation the following week. Since then, Incarnation has become one of the fastest growing Episcopal churches in the country, tripling in size in two years. When God called Father Tom to Incarnation, he spoke clearly that prayer would be the power behind the transformation of the church and its people. That value continues to drive Incarnation forward today. (Father Tom is the Chaplain for Incarnation's new chapter of Daughters of the King.)

Before being ordained as a Priest, Tom was one of the founding members of Emmaus Ministries, an interdenominational Bible school that takes young adults through the content of the entire Bible in 10 months. Tom and several others launched the school in 2006 in partnership with Youth With a Mission, the world's largest missions organization. He spent a decade discipling young adults with Emmaus, and still regularly teaches in training programs with Youth With a Mission. He very much has a passion to see people know God through the pages of God's word, and experience God's presence daily through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Tom and his wife Julia have been married 15 years, and have two children (Anna and Luke). Tom and Julia are both life-long Episcopalians, yet they met in college while serving at a Pentacostal summer camp in the mountains of North Carolina. Their 10+ years of service at that camp gave them both a passion for the power and presence of the Holy Spirit and a desire to pray liturgy from the heart. Together, Tom and Julia share a love for all things outdoors. Biking, rock climbing, and mountains are loves they both share, and together they are trying to run the race of life well for God's glory and the world's good.



OFFERINGS

This retreat is being offered to the members of Province IV Daughters of the King at no charge. While it is not the retreat we usually have, we hope you will be blessed by our speakers and virtual fellowship with each other. As there is no charge, we ask you to prayerfully consider sending an offering. The collected offerings will be divided between Canterbury Retreat Center (Oviedo, FL), Kanuga Conference & Retreat Center (Hendersonville, NC), and St. Luke's Community House (Nashville, TN).

During the ongoing pandemic, Canterbury Retreat Center found itself having to cancel bookings. At the same time, the Canterbury staff became aware of the need for medical workers to have a place to live temporarily so they could protect their families from possible exposure to the virus. The Canterbury Board (our own Krisita Jackson is a member of the board) decided to open its doors and provided food and lodging for approximately 45 medical workers. They are still housing medical personnel.

Kanuga has also canceled bookings, closed through (as of now) June, and is unsure of what lies ahead. This closure has been detrimental to its funding and future. Any offering we can send to Kanuga will be greatly appreciated and used to help meet its monthly obligations.

Earlier this spring, downtown Nashville was hit by a large tornado. The Executive Committee became aware of a family (single mom with three children, one is special needs) who lost everything in the tornado. Using part of budgeted funds for Outreach, we were able to send financial assistance for this family. The children attend the Episcopal school at St. Luke's and our donation helped keep the children in school. Others in Tennessee and throughout our Province are still in need of assistance.

JUNIOR DAUGHTERS RESOURCES AND ACTIVITIES TO GO ALONG WITH SPEAKER SESSIONS

- 1. <u>Craft</u> Make a banner, flag, or wall hanging with our theme, "The Lord Almighty Is With Us Always."
- 2. <u>Bible Study for Juniors</u> using Exodus 13:17-22. God led the Israelites with pillars of cloud and fire. Directresses and Juniors discuss the ways God was with the Israelites in the desert when they left Egypt and discuss ways that God is with us in our lives today. This could be a Zoom Junior Daughters Chapter meeting.
- 3. **Zoom** Have a tutorial about using Zoom for Chapter Meetings.

- 4. <u>Mandalas</u> Discuss in a small group with Directresses, Moms, and Juniors ways to use the Mandala as a meditation tool during prayer time. Download some Mandalas for Juniors to color. Possible resources:

- 5. <u>Prayer</u> Discuss the importance of taking time to pray each day and connect with our Lord who is always with us. Go to the National DOK website: www.doknational.org Resources Literature for Juniors-Leader's Guide for Primary Grade and Youth Junior Daughters Study Guide (2011) to find prayer resources on p. 49.
- 6. <u>Journaling</u> The Lord is with us during this pandemic. Possible journal topics: How has your life changed during the pandemic? What was school like in March May? How did you feel about that? What are some ways you have been able to share the love of Christ with others? Another idea: Keep a Blessings Journal.
- 7. **Role Models** Name people you believe show the love of God to others. Have some stories about nurses, doctors, first responders etc., from the news available showing

what these people have been doing during the pandemic. What does it mean to think of others before yourself? Why would God want us to do that? How can you serve others with material things, with love, and support? Write letters to these people in your community to thank them.

- 8. <u>Bible Study: The Lord's Prayer</u> Scripture: Matthew 6:5- 13 Why did Jesus teach the disciples the Lord's Prayer? How does the Lord's Prayer show that God cares about each of us? What are the things that we ask God for in this prayer? Following the pattern of The Lord's Prayer, write your own prayer.
- 9. <u>Helping those in need of food</u> Chapter or individual service project. Collect canned goods for local food pantry.
- 10. <u>Craft: Prayer Bears</u> Mary Rife, Diocesan Assembly President of SC, and her chapter have made prayer bears to share with children in the hospital. Also, they could be used for children in a homeless shelter. Bears may be sewn by hand or machine. For bear pattern and machine sewing of bears see:

- 11. <u>Art: Posters for Nurses and Doctors, First Responders, EMS, etc.</u> Make posters to deliver to nurses, doctors, EMS, Grocery store workers etc., to thank them for all they are doing to help during the pandemic.
- 12. <u>Music</u> Juniors, Moms, and Directresses can sing along to some worship/praise songs. Select a familiar melody and write a song using our theme, "The Lord Almighty is with us Always". For 2 Hours Non-Stop Worship Songs of 2019 with Lyrics-Best Christian Songs go to:

- 13. Take a walk/hike around your neighborhood, a park, your own yard, etc. What are some ways that you know God is with you each day? Why do you think God wants to be with us each day? What are some ways each of us can grow closer to God? Trace the outline of your feet and use the paper feet to record some things you want to remember about God that you thought about on your walk. Beverly Lloyd, Diocesan Assembly President of Atlanta, compiled "Walking with God" a trail walk guide used at Fall Kanuga,

- 14. Juniors share ideas with senior DALs who live in their Diocesan Assembly through email Juniors write, draw, etc., to express what they have learned during the online retreat and what they want to do in their Junior Chapters to continue learning more about following Jesus each day and sharing His love. Ask the DAL to pray for them and offer to pray for the DAL. Building relationships!
- 15. Newsletter articles or do a bulletin board in the parish Juniors could decorate a parish bulletin board with drawings, articles, etc., showing what they learned during the online retreat or write articles for their parish newsletters about their experiences participating in an online retreat. Great way to share what the chapter is doing and possibly be part of encouraging more girls in the parish to become Junior Daughters.
- 16. <u>Use the Activities and Projects section in the Junior Directress Manual</u> p. 71 for more service ideas for Juniors. - 5. <u>Prayer</u> Write and illustrate a prayer of thanksgiving to God for being with us at all times. Give an example for the individual or group to discuss before writing their own prayers.
- 6. <u>Timeline</u> Think about and record on a timeline the way your understanding of the power of God has developed during your life. What attributes/characteristics of God would you use to describe God's power? What experiences have you had that helped you understand more about the power of God and His provision for you?

- 7. <u>Discussion</u> How does our theme, "The Lord Almighty is With us Always," relate to the current pandemic our world is experiencing? Have you had personal experiences you would like to share in a Zoom chapter meeting during this time of social distancing?

Be prepared to discuss and ask questions about the nominations and elections process for Fall Assembly. The Province IV Bylaw regarding elections and nominations is on the following page.

Excerpt from Province IV Bylaws Article IV – Officers

Section 2. Nominations and Elections

In the first quarter of the year prior to the year of the National Convention, the Provincial President shall appoint a nominating committee of three (3) members. This committee shall present to the Annual Meeting a slate of nominees of at least one candidate for each elected office from the qualified applicants. Additional nomination may be made from the floor with the prior knowledge and consent of the nominee(s).

In addition to the slate of officers the nominating committee shall present to the Annual Meeting nominees for the Daughter-at-Large Delegate to National Convention.

The Daughter-at-Large Delegate to Triennial shall attend the Triennial Meeting that follows her election with voice and vote at the Triennial Business Meetings. She is not required to attend Provincial Assembly Board Meetings.

To be eligible for nomination to a Provincial office, a Daughter must be current in her dues, have held some office in a chapter, Assembly of a Diocese, or Provincial Assembly, and have been a member of The Order of the Daughters of the King® for at least three (3) years. To be eligible for the Daughters-at-Large Delegate position, the Daughter must meet the qualification of a Daughter at Large and shall also meet the above criteria and be proposed by her Diocesan Executive committee.

A simple majority of the votes cast by the delegates present at the Annual Meeting is needed to elect.
